Sydney Opera House, also known as the AMP Tower or Centrepoint (literally "central point"), the tallest building standing alone in Sydney and the second tallest in Australia (after Q1 skyscraper on the Gold Coast, in Queensland), it is also the second highest observation tower in the Southern Hemisphere (after the "Tower of Heaven" the city of Auckland, New Zealand). Sydney Tower is included in the World Federation of Great Towers. It is open to visitors and is one of the main attractions of the city.

Sindeyskaya tower rises 305 meters (1001 ft) above the Sydney Central Business District, 100 Market Street (between Pitt and Castlereagh streets), where the business and shopping center of the city.

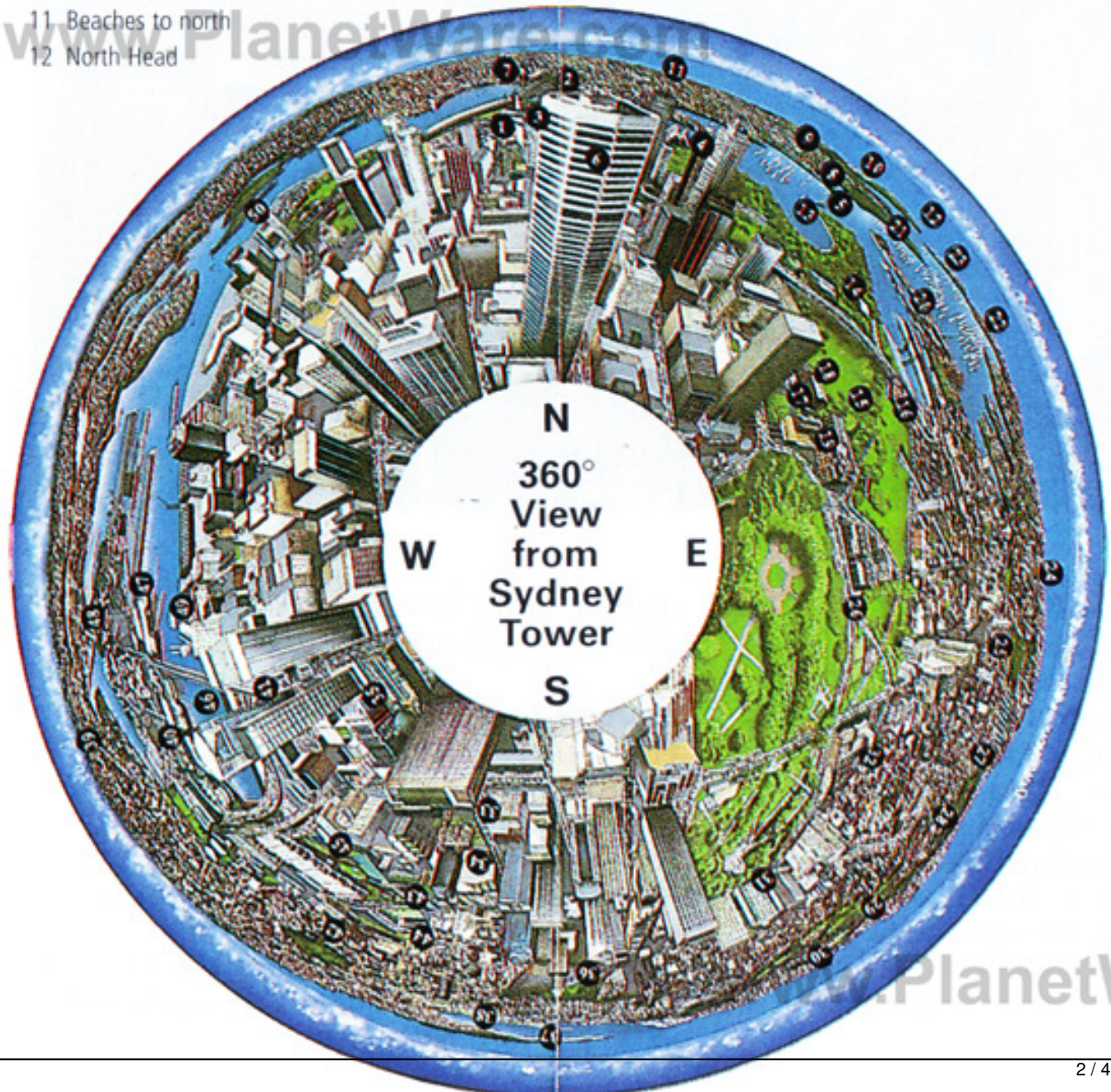
